

FAQs - GCSE English Language and Literature

What pathways are on offer?

All students will sit both AQA English Language and AQA English Literature. There is no higher or foundation paper, all students will sit the exact same papers and will all have an opportunity to pertain all available grades. All students will also take AQA's Speaking and Listening examination which is not part of the GCSE qualification. This will give students a separate speaking qualification to place on university applications and future CVs to prove their fluency in English.

Will either GCSE involve coursework?

No. At present, the AQA Language and Literature courses are 100% examination-based. Your child will sit two English Literature papers in May of Year 11, and two English Language papers in June of Year 11.

What texts will my child study for GCSE Literature?

All students will study:

- A Shakespeare play
- A modern (post-1914) text
- A 19th Century novel
- A poetry anthology

The text itself will depend on which English class your child is in. Currently, our students study:

- Macbeth or Romeo and Juliet
- An Inspector Calls or Lord of the Flies
- The Strange Case of Jekyll and Hyde or A Christmas Carol or Frankenstein or Pride and Prejudice
- The AQA Poetry anthology

In general, students who are well-read and familiar with a broad variety of texts (not just the ones explored in class with their teachers) will perform best, not just within the English GCSEs but across all of their GCSEs. Specifically in English Literature, examiners are most impressed by students who can discuss the *typicality* of a text to its author or time-period, this would involve the student ensuring

What grade in English does my child need to achieve to take A Levels at Jumeirah College Sixth Form?

A grade 5 in English Language is needed to access most A Levels at Jumeirah College Sixth Form, with certain subjects (English Language, Biology, Business, Economics) needing at least a grade 6 in English Language to enroll on the course.
