

# Science GCSE options FAQs

## What is the difference between Triple and Combined science at GCSE?

All students will automatically be entered to study Combined science unless they opt to do Triple science and achieve the necessary entry requirements. Combined science is the 'normal' option. The Combined science students will have 2x Biology, 2x Chemistry and 2x Physics lessons a week. Triple science students will have 3x Biology, 3x Chemistry and 3x Physics lessons a week.

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#### What are the entry requirements for Triple science?

Your child will need to achieve a minimum of a level 7b.

### If my child wants to study one of the sciences at A-level will they need to have taken Triple science?

No, students will need to have achieved a grade 7 in their chosen science if they studied triple and a combined science grade of 7-8.

## Can my child take the Higher tier rather than the Foundation tier?

Here at Jumeirah College we endeavor to challenge all students to achieve their best. The Majority of students will be entered for the higher tier but there is an option for a student to sit the foundation paper, which a few students may be eligible for.



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
